Executive Committee By-Laws

Article I: Name The name of the Organization shall be the "U.S.S. HARRY E. HUBBARD (DD-748) Reunion Organization"

Article II: Purpose A. Form an Executive Committee, in order to conduct HEH business at and between annual reunion/business meetings. B. Continue efforts to locate as many crew members as possible. C. Obtain as appropriate, and publish information related to deceased crew members. D. Continue to foster the Goodwill and Comradeship of all crew members. E. Conduct annual reunions F. Do all possible to carry on the memory and tradition of the Harry E. Hubbard and the crew members who served aboard.

Article III: Executive Committee A. Form a volunteer Executive Committee, of five shipmates and one alternate. NOTE: Alternate member will be copied on all correspondence, and fill in for members who are temporarily unable to fulfill their duties. B. The Executive Committee will realize no compensation or financial gain for services rendered the HEH Organization. Attending annual reunion/business meeting does not constitute an event to be compensated. C. Compensation will only occur for business directly related to and for the sole purpose of HEH business. Business or trips should be pre-approved by ExecutiveCommittee Members. A review, which includes receipts for any and all business related, activities in support the HEH Organization, will be reviewed and approved, prior to any reimbursement. D. The number of shipmates serving as Executive Committee members may be modified by majority vote of all shipmates attending the next, or any subsequent annual business meeting. E. The Executive Committee will be responsible for business decisions relative to the HEH Organization. F. Before any definitive votes by the Executive Committee occur a minimum of three members must be present. The alternate may serve as one of the voting members. G. HEH business, between annual business meetings, should decisions be required. The Executive Committee through phone, SKYPE, chat, or other social media as agreed to by The Executive Committee will occur in order to conduct said business. Results of those decisions will be published as soon as possible. Through the newsletter, mailings and or e-mails

etc. H. Length of terms for the Executive Committee will be voted on by all shipmates present at the October, 2017 business meeting. NOTE: Recommendation, is that length of terms be staggered. i.e. 5, 3 and 2 years respectively. Shipmates may serve consecutive terms. I. The Executive Committee officers, Chairman and Vice-Chairman, will be determined by vote at the October 2017 business meeting. Results will be part the minutes of October 2017 meeting.

Article IV: Banking and Finances A. The two shipmates currently overseeing the finances and check writing for the HEH Organization will continue as is until such time as either individual no longer wishes to carry on the HEH activities. B. When one or both of the shipmates, desire to no longer carry out banking and financial activities, the Executive Committee will appoint a Treasurer and or Assistant Treasurer, or consider any shipmate who may volunteer for the duties. NOTE: Banking and Financial oversight may be filled at the appropriate time by any shipmate willing and able to conduct the HEH financial and banking business and need not be an Executive Committee member. C. The Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer roles will serve to control and direct all financial transactions related the HEH Organization and business. D. Any special expenditures shall be preapproved by the Executive Committee. E. Upon completion of services by the current Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer all records, funds and properties belonging to the HEH Organization shall be turned over to their successor.

Article V: Removal of an Executive Committee Member A. If it should be necessary for the removal of an acting Executive Committee shipmate for actions deemed to be detrimental of the non-profit HEH Organization, The following process will occur. A-1. The Executive Committee shipmates, including the alternate, will review all evidence relative to the detrimental activity. A-2. The accused member will have the opportunity to present their case relative to the accusation. A-3. The Executive Committee will then privately determine the validity of all information provided. A vote will be required, (By the Executive Committee) with the majority determining the final result of and future participation as a member of the Executive Committee.

Article VI: Amendment of By-Laws. A. HEH By-laws may be Amended, Altered or Repealed by a Quorum of the Executive Committee or by a majority of shipmates, present at the next, or any subsequent business meeting. B. Information to be considered for amending, alteration or repeal should be provided to the Executive Committee a minimum of two weeks prior to the vote..

Article VII: Dissolution of the Executive Committee. A. The Executive Committee may be dissolved by a vote off all shipmates, present at the next, or any subsequent scheduled business meeting.

Remembering Departed Shipmates

Louis Adams: Last April we received a note from Norm Eldridge (FP2, 52-55) asking why we did not have the death of Louis Adams (GM3, 52-54) listed in the newsletter. It had been widely reported in newspapers in Montana but the association did not

know about it because mail was still going to the Adams address in Arlee, Montana and not being returned by the postal service. Louis died April 25, 2016 of a heart attack en route to a hospital in Missoula. He was 82. Norm spent part of each year in Montana, his native state, and was in



the same class in elementary school with Louis. Norm said Louis was on the quarterdeck watch when he reported aboard Jan. 22, 1953 in San Diego. Then we had a note from Robert Gilbreath (FT3, 63-67) saying that he had no idea that Louis lived just 30 miles down the road and that he might have seen him at the Salish-Kootnai PowWows held every summer in Arlee. Louis had been an important figure in the Salish community of Native Americans, an elder and tribal historian. He retired in 2002 after 42 years as a forester. He received an honorary degree from the University of Montana for his presentations on tribal history. The Salish were removed from the Bitterroot Valley in 1891 and relocated north of Missoula. Norm Eldridge: Just prior to publication of this newsletter we received word that Norm too had died. He had attended this past reunion but was not feeling well and returned early to California. Norm and his wife Sally had attended many reunions and there was never a more likable and friendly shipmate. Reading his obituary I learned that he had taken his plumbing trade learned in the Navy into civilian life and was a plumber and a plumbing contractor.

Captain Theodore R. Johnson, Jr., Executive Officer of USS Harry E. Hubbard from March 22 1961 to May 10 1962, died March 20 2017 in Costa Mesa California. From Hubbard he went on to command two other destroyers, USS Floyd D. Parks (DD-884) and USS Ernest G. Small (DDR-838). Prior to Hubbard he had commanded USS Des Plaines River (LFR-412) and USS Persistent (MSO-491). A native of Sioux Falls South Dakota, he was a graduate of Yale University 1944 with a BA in

English and of the U.S. Naval Academy, graduating in 1947 with a B.S. in Marine Engineering. He was a special warfare qualified Underwater Demolition Team (UDT) officer and scuba diver. He received the Legion of Merit with Combat V, Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Combat Action Ribbon and numerous other awards. He completed marathons into his 60's and also competed in swimming. At age 70 he won the National Title for his age group for the five mile rough water swim in San Pedro. At age 82 he won a national title in the 10K long distance swim. He was married for 54 years to Frances Floriano Johnson, who was a LT in the Navy Nurse Corps when they married. Services were conducted at Fort Meyer, Va. prior to internment at Arlington National Cemetery.

RD2 Henry Luna 63-66 wrote to ask about a 2nd Class Boats in '63 who had a portable sewing machine and would do basic alterations and sew on patches. SH3 Al Eisenbraun 63-67 identifies him as BM2 Warren Neuerburg 62-65 of Newkirk OK. Warren drove over and spent part of the day at the Oklahoma reunion this year. There was also Jay Paceley, who came aboard November 1962 as a Gunners Mate Second. He had a little compartment up by the 3 inch guns with a sewing machine and would do all our sewing for us. He left as a GM1 in 1966. I tried locating him but found out he passed away in November 1994. After he left we had to take our uniforms to town and have the sewing done. Jay spoiled us, only charging about a dollar to sew the Hubbard patch on, or our rating patches. He charged more to bell bottom the trousers. I think I have a picture of him with his little sewing machine but haven't located it yet. **James Doss 66-69** notes that after Jay left it was GMG1 Jimmie Rogers that did it. WO1 Harry Dillon (DCFN) 59-60 When I was aboard there was a QM1 [Senio] Martinez that had a sewing machine but he would only do sewing for his friends. I tried to have him sew something for me, even offering to pay but he always found a reason not to do so. FTG1 Larry P. Davis (FTG3) 68-69: During the 68-69 cruise I picked up a Brothers sewing machine for my wife in Japan. I got some thread and other sewing items at that time for personal use. I had been sewing since I was in grade school — being one of seven kids you learned to do things for yourself. I learned to sew on an old Singer sewing machine my mom did not use anymore. I sewed on all of my Boy Scout patches and even sewed together a canvas tent, which I still have. Word got out on ship and soon I was in the sewing business after working hours. I was making short sleeve dungaree shirts out of long sleeve ones and I hemmed pants. Crows and ship patches came later. I think I even did a couple of khaki shirts for chiefs/ By the end of the cruise I had paid for the sewing machine. The picture in the cruise book on page 69 of me and FTG3 Gary Wayne Ely in the GFCS 56 radar room shows the sewing machine. I'm the good looking skinny guy in glasses. When we returned to Long Beach the sewing machine went ashore to my wife, who used that old Brothers sewing machine for many years. She gave it to our oldest daughter, who sold it a few years ago.

The Hubbard Challenge Coin

SN Peter Foley 69 contacted Al Eisenbraun after the San Diego reunion wanting to know if we could have a challenge coin made for the ship. Al contacted a couple of companies. The cost would be \$300 to set up the dies to cast the coins plus a guarantee to purchase 100 of the coins at \$6.50 each. The \$950 seemed too big a hurdle but Jenifer Shook, daughter of RD1 Charles Shook, volunteered the funds to make it happen, as a surprise to her father. Al subsequently got a better price - dies plus 200 coins



for a total of \$939. The Executive Committee gave it the go-ahead and approved a sales price of \$10 per coin plus \$3.50 for shipping (up to 5 in one envelope). Availability was announced on the yahoo circuit and
